


### Swat

#### Taki-i-Bahi

- The Buddhist Ruins of Takhi-i-Bahi (Throne of Origins) are a monastic complex, founded in the early 1st century A.D., is spectacularly positioned on various hilltops ranging from 36.6 metres to 152.4 metres in height, typical for Buddhist sites. It was listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1980.

#### · Shingardar Stupa

- The most remarkable of Buddhist monument in Swat. In local legend, to a king named Uttarasena. This man is said to have collected, on his master's own command, the relics of Buddha, and have stored them in this huge stupa.

#### **Karimabad**

#### Nanga Parbat

- Known locally as Diamer 'King of the Mountains', is the 9th highest mountain on Earth, its summit at 8,126 m above sea level. It is the westernmost major peak of the Himalayas and has earned the nickname Killer Mountain for its high number of climber fatalities and pushing climbers to the test of their limits.

#### · Rakaposhi

- It is part of the World Heritage site. It was built in the second half of the 4th century AD and was one of the largest churches on the island. Originally it had 7 aisles, which were reduced to five during alterations in the 6th century. In the central aisle, 3 unique figural scenes representing Christian allegories are preserved.

#### · Baltit Fort

- A fort in the Hunza valley. Founded in the 8th century CE. The Mirs of Hunza abandoned the fort in 1945, and moved to a new palace down the hill. It has been on the UNESCO World Heritage Tentative list since 2004.

# Gilgit

#### Shatial Rock Carving

- While traveling along the Karakorum Highway, one come across many rock art sites which need to be promoted as potential tourist destinations. Shatial is a small town located on the Karakorum Highway (KKH) which is known for Buddhist and Zoroastrian symbolism and hundreds of ancient scripts.

#### **Islamabad**

#### Taxila Museum

- One of the most important archaeological sites in Asia, and named a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1980. Julian Monastery, Sirkap City Ruins and Dharmarajika Stupa are herritage that located in Taxila Museum

#### Daman-E-Koh

- A hilltop garden north of Islamabad. It is in the center of the Margalla Hills. The name is a fusion of 2 Persian words, which collectively denote 'foothills'. It is about 2400 ft above sea level and about 500 ft above Islamabad. From the southern spot, there is a panoramic view of Islamabad. Faisal Mosque, Seventh Avenue, and Rawal Lake are all visible to the visitors.
